OLDER BROTHER [Luke 15:25-31]

Right actions doesn't always equal right heart

Observations about the older brother:

1. His **language** is distant and insulting

"Look!"
"This son of yours"

2. Entitlement of what he is owed

"All these years I've been slaving for you"
"I've never disobeyed you"

3. **Resentment** and **bitterness** is growing

"He became angry and refused to go in"
"You never gave me...."

"elder brother lostness" - growing angry, bitter, and cynical toward God when life doesn't go the way you think it should because you're "being good"

"The older brother in this story shows us something profound – you can be in the Father's <u>HOME</u> and still be distancing yourself from the Father's <u>HEART</u>." - Ian Simkins

Two <u>spiritual</u> <u>disciplines</u> to help us break free of our elder brother lostness:

1. DELIGHT

<u>Results</u>-based obedience -> **<u>Delight</u>**-based obedience

2. TRUST
