AWAKENING CHURCH'S NEW YEAR READING PLAN: 50 Days Through Genesis

Theme: *"In the Beginning..."*

"This year, we're starting where it all begins—with Genesis. At Awakening, we believe biblical literacy matters—not just getting into God's Word but allowing the Word of God to get into you. It's about seeing God's story as the foundation of your story. Genesis is a book of beginnings: creation, humanity, brokenness, and the first whispers of God's redemptive plan that point us to Jesus. Together, let's take 50 days to read, reflect, and let God shape us as we begin this new year

Why Genesis?

Genesis is the starting line of Scripture. It introduces us to God as **Creator**, reveals His purpose for humanity, and unpacks the brokenness that marks our world. But even in the mess, we see the seeds of **hope**—a God who is already writing a redemptive story.

By reading Genesis one chapter per day, you'll:

- 1. **Discover** God's story as the foundation of your faith.
- 2. Grow in understanding God's character—Creator, Sustainer, and Redeemer.
- 3. Let it shape you—seeing where your story intersects with God's bigger plan.

How to Engage Each Day

We know it can be overwhelming to start a Bible reading plan. That's why we've designed this to be simple, clear, and practical. You'll only need 10-15 minutes each day:

Follow this Daily Engagement Guide:

1. S.O.A.P. Method

S (Scripture): Read the day's chapter from Genesis.

O (**Observation**): What stood out to you? What do you notice about God or humanity?

A (Application): How does this apply to your life today?

P (**Prayer**): Close with a prayer—responding to God's Word.

2. Reflect on Three Key Questions:

What does this chapter teach me about God? What does this reveal about humanity? How is God inviting me to respond today?

The Plan: 50 Days in Genesis

Beginning **January 1**, **2025**, we'll read one chapter a day for 50 days. This plan takes us from creation to the story of Joseph, showing us that God's plans are sovereign, His promises are trustworthy, and His grace meets us right where we are.

Practical Next Steps

- 1. **Set a Time:** Whether it's morning coffee, lunchtime, or evening wind-down, pick a time each day to read and reflect.
- 2. Have a Notebook or Journal Ready: Write down observations, prayers, or anything God reveals as you read.
- 3. **Invite Others to Join You:** Growth happens best in community. Share the plan with friends or your small group.
